not-for-profit organizations through a grant process. These funds are generated from gaming receipts received through the Isle of Capri Casino-Bettendorf.

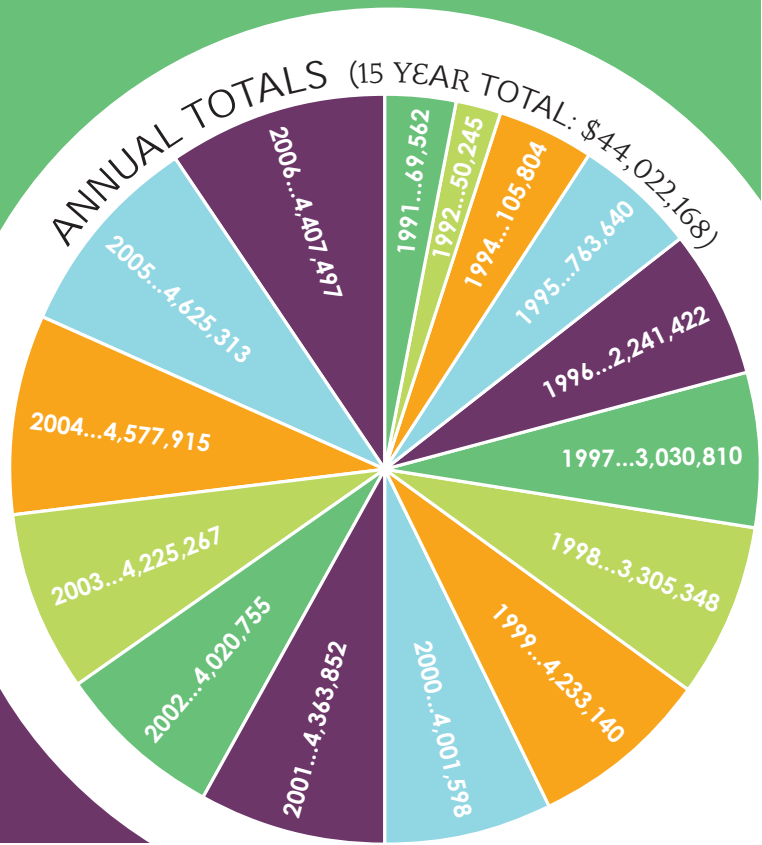

BLUE GRASS TRAIL

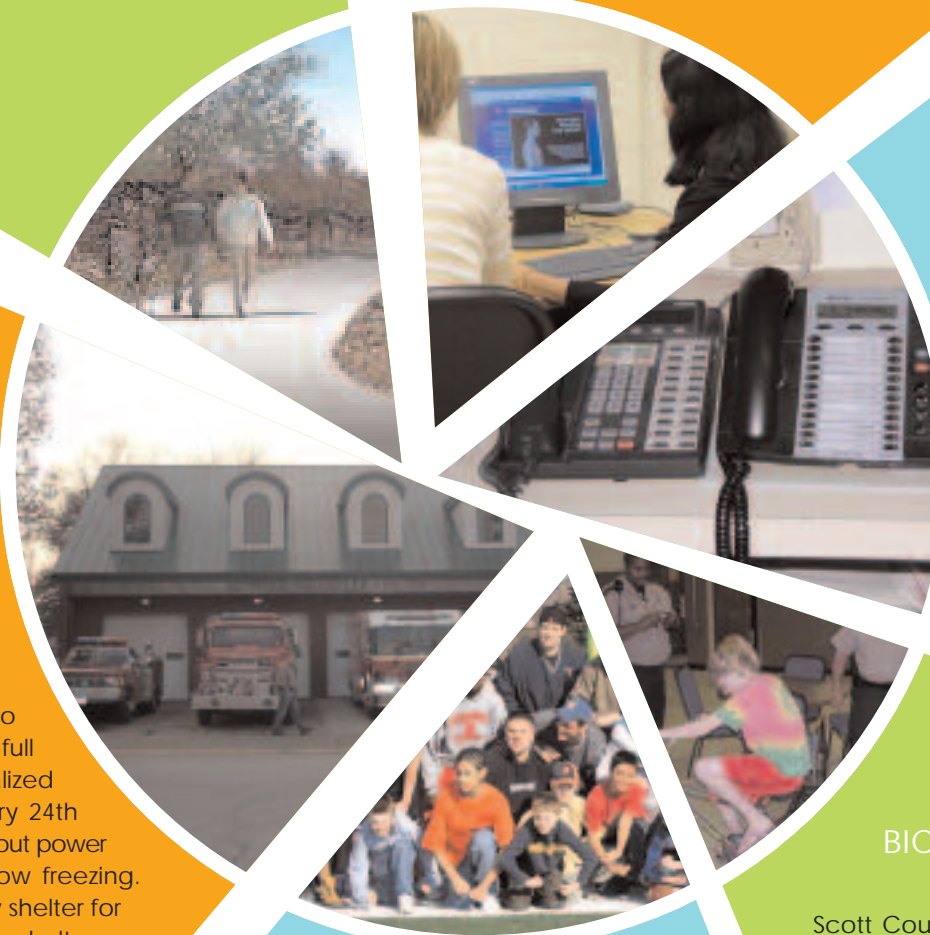
Blue Grass, Iowa is most grateful for SCRA's continued support throughout the years. Blue Grass is a part of Scott County, Iowa, located between the cities of Davenport and Muscatine. With a population of 1,169, it is known for its' quiet rural community and small town atmosphere.

Blue Grass' most recent grant awarded by the SCRA was to fund a portion of the "The Blue Grass Trail" which is currently underway and will begin it's first of three phases during the Summer of 2007. The Blue Grass Trail was first announced in the Fall of 2005 and immediately won the support of the community. Without grant funding, The Blue Grass Trail would not be feasible, nor would many other projects that have been SCRA supported in the past.

SCOTT COUNTY COLLEGE

Radiographic technology is one of the most popular programs at Scott Community College, and our graduates are in great demand in this area and beyond. It's critical that our students have an opportunity to learn the skills on the same equipment that is used in area hospitals and clinics so that they are fully prepared for future employment.

SCRA's support of the purchase of digital radiography equipment for the program means that our students will graduate with hands-on experience on state-of-the-art equipment. We are excited to have this high-tech equipment manufactured, delivered, installed and ready for our Fall 2007 students.



ELDRIDGE FIRE STATION

Last spring, we received a \$50,000 grant from the SCRA. That funding enabled us to kick start our 3,800 sq. ft. new room & roof remodel. Previously, we met and trained in an old apparatus bay. Now we have a state-of-the-art meeting room which is being used to host a Firefighter I class for a neighboring department.

An emergency generator was also added to supply our station with full power in case of an outage. We realized it's value during the recent February 24th ice storm. The City of Eldridge was without power for 12 hours with temperatures below freezing. Our station became the emergency shelter for the town because the community shelter did not have a back up power source.

Our previous roof was aging and leaking despite numerous repairs. We now have a standing seam metal roof system with a life of 30+ years. The second floor is 3,800 sq. ft. for future expansion & much needed storage. Our office is now finished upstairs. We also have room to meet the needs of a growing community.

BIG BROTHERS BIG SISTERS OF THE MISSISSIPPI VALLEY

The Building for Kids campaign has been an important tool in achieving our vision of impacting 1,000 children by 2010. The new Quad City Mentoring Center is a tool not simply because it is brick and mortar - but because it is a facility that will stand as the anchor for thousands of volunteers, families and children in our community who believe that an individual can make a positive difference in a child's life. The Quad City Mentoring Center is a building that will build long-lasting relationships in our community.

The Scott County Regional Authority was one of the first to step forward and make the investment in helping achieve this vision.

DOMESTIC VIOLENCE SHELTER

We are so pleased to have SCRA funds to assist with supplies for our shelter. The new copier makes it considerably easier to manage paperwork for staff and clients.

The voicemail system has lessened the workload of phone calls.

The mattresses have helped us provide a cleaner and healthier bedroom area for shelter residents, and allow for easier cleaning of the beds between residents.

BICYCLE RESTORATION PROJECT

Scott County Jail Community Restoration team has restored over 130 unwanted bikes and has given them to agencies in Scott County. Most of the men and women who receive the restored bikes have lost driving privileges but need transportation for employment.

Many bikes go to children and are often the first bike they have ever owned or replace a bicycle that was stolen and cannot be replaced by family due to cost. The Scott County Regional Authority has enabled the Bicycle Restoration Program to purchase parts, tools and the necessary equipment to refurbish bicycles for our community.
