They can be picked up March 1st and September 1st and are due to the office April 1st and October 1st, respectively.

#### MISSISSIPPI VALLEY **TRACK CLUB**

With the assistance of the SCRA, the Mississippi Valley Track Club was able to purchase new uniforms and track equipment such as starting blocks, discuses, javelins, etc. There was a record turnout of over 100 young athletes joining the club for the 2008 season.

**MVTC** feels that the track program provided to youth is "growing change" in the community by providing opportunity for them take pride in the improvements and accomplishments in events they enter; giving them an opportunity to showcase the talent and kindness of Quad City youth to other people at regional and national track meets they attend; providing them an outlet for physical activity during the summer; and lastly, providing an established regimen of hard work and dedication that will stay with them as they mature and become involved in the community through jobs and volunteerism.

SCRA Grant Award: \$2.500




The library is "making a difference" also through its recognition by the International City / County Management Association (ICMA) for the high rating it received (91%) from its 2006 Citizen's Survey. This was the highest rating nationally for customer service, and for that reason, Davenport Public Library was included in its "best practices" publication, What Works: How Local Governments Have Made the Leap from Measurement to Management, 2008.

The library also received a similar high rating in its 2008 Citizen's Survey. The library is preparing for extending library services through Eastern Avenue Branch Library which is anchoring a new subdivision in the north central areas of the city. The Vision Iowa Board has anded a Community Attraction and Tourism (CAT) grant of \$1.2 million for the project which will provide a Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) building that will indeed attract many visitors from throughout the region. A ground-breaking ceremony is being planned for July with opening of the new facility in June 2010. Without the support of SCRA, this project would not be possible. Thanks to SCRA for truly "growing change" through the assistance with this economic development project!

#### **GROWING CHANGE FOR DAVENPORT PUBLIC LIBRARY**

Davenport Public Library is definitely experiencing change with its "Branching, Out" Project. This project has included the construction of the Fairmount facility which has been very successful. The opening of that facility has actually increased usage at the Main Library. In a State Library of Iowa study that was conducted in January 2009 comparing the 1st six months of FY2009 to the 1st six months of FY2008, the study showed that total computer usage had increased by 30%. Davenport's library programs for teens and for children have been recognized by the national and state media as exceptional.



#### THE ELDRIDGE VOLUNTEER FIRE COMPANY

The Eldridge Volunteer Fire Co., Inc. feels that obtaining this Rescue Pumper is "growing change" in the community because it is allows the accomplishment of more tasks in a more efficient manner. The department has seen a significant increase in emergency call volume in recent years but a decrease in membership.

This project allows response to calls of any nature with minimal staffing, if necessary. Currently, when responding to vehicle accidents, the EVFC has to respond with 2 apparatus. This project allows for consolidation and response with 1 apparatus if manpower is an issue. Also, the possibility of returning from an emergency medical call and having to respond to an emergency call of a fire nature has greatly increased. This project is a sign of the times and justifies the need for efficiency.

SCRA Grant Award: \$50,000



#### PLEASANT VALLEY JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOL

The SCRA grant has provided Pleasant Valley Junior High students with a great opportunity to explore mathematics through technology. The technology (laptops, graphing calculators and interactive whiteboards) has allowed students to go beyond the basic concepts and learn how the mathematical concepts are connected to each other. The technology aids (proximas and document cameras) have raised the interest level of the students as educators can relate the concepts to real life applications in ways that were not possible before.

The exposure to technology at an early age helps students see problems from many different perspectives and helps them grasp that a problem may be solved multiple ways with the same solution in the end. The students and mathematics department would like to thank the community and the SCRA board for their generosity and support of education.

#### NORTH SCOTT SCHOOL DISTRICT: NORTH SCOTT JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOL

Student safety is the number one priority at North Scott Junior High School. Thanks to a recent SCRA grant, students have are now even safer. Hallways, parking lots, entrances and exits are monitored before, during and after school by a new web-based video surveillance system. This equipment is used in a proactive manner so that potentially harmful or illegal incidents can be avoided.

Additionally, any necessary investigations now require less time to complete, allowing the availability of human resources to help students become successful agents of positive change in our community and in their lives.

#### SCRA Grant Award: \$164,421



#### NORTH SCOTT SCHOOL DISTRICT: ORCHESTRA PROGRAM

The North Scott School District has grow over the last two years. The recent addition of the orchestra has added interest and interaction among students and the community.

We have more than doubled in size since we started the program last year and there are currently students in the high school and junior high orchestra. The addition of the orchestra took time and planning, but without the grant money we would not have instruments for the students. We have also received grant money to further expand the program due to the large interest in student participation! This program also helps students from other districts continue to play when they begin attending this district. This was never an option before the program started.

SCRA Grant Award: \$164,421



#### **ST. AMBROSE UNIVERSITY**

St. Ambrose University is 'growing change' in the community with the development and implementation of a graduate program in speech-language pathology that will enroll students beginning in the fall of 2009. Supported in part by a grant from the SCRA, this program will teach future practioners to identify and prevent speech, language and early reading development risk factors in pre-school children. Early detection and prevention services may decrease unnecessary referral to special education for struggling children who can benefit from modified instructional techniques, short-term but intensive remediation, ESL instruction or hearing services.

SCRA funding will allow St. Ambrose to grow change in the community by providing these screening and prevention services free of charge to pre-schoolers enrolled at All Saints Catholic School, Friendly House of the Quad Cities Early Learning Program, the Friendly Kid's daycare program and the St. Ambrose University Children's Campus.

SCRA Grant Award: \$61,713



#### THE QUAD CITIES WATERFRONT CONVENTION CENTER

The Quad Cities Waterfront Convention Center is a prime example of the progressive vision local government has for the City of Bettendorf. The facility is a significant achievement for the redevelopment of the downtown and riverfront area. It was the cooperation of the City Council, Isle of Capri and other partnerships such as the Scott County Regional Authority, Vision lowa Board and the Scott County Board of Supervisors that created this unique facility.

The Waterfront has and will attract business meetings, conventions and other special event to the area. The Waterfront is not just a significant project for Bettendorf, but the entire Quad Cities area. Other cities will benefit as visitors enjoy concerts, sports and cultural events and the natural habitat along the Mississippi River. The Waterfront will become a major business and tourist attraction, which will make Bettendorf and the Quad Cities area a destination point for the Midwest.
